Sculptors, weavers, and booksellers among those selling their wares at annual conference and performance festival celebrating the power of myth

Atlanta, GA – The third annual Mythic Journeys conference and performance festival once again will play host to a wide array of artisans in its Mythic Marketplace. Potters, sculptors and other artists will be selling their creations to event guests and attendees June 7-11, 2006 at the Atlanta Hyatt Regency Hotel.

According to Marketplace Chair Kathleen Pope Bingaman, the Marketplace is intended to "highlight artists who are working with mythic themes in creating their art; who have been inspired by myth, culture and legend in their creations; or who are actively recreating the symbols and mythic art of their culture."

The Marketplace also provides an opportunity for Mythic Journeys participants to purchase the books and music of this year's presenters. Event partner, the Atlanta-based Phoenix and Dragon Bookstore, will provide these resources.

Live music will give the Marketplace not just the look but also the sound and feel of a village market. Guests and attendees interested in becoming part of this unique environment can help to create a community quilt at the onsite quilting Imagination Station.
